- 9:30 AM Arrive at the **Boston Tea Party Ships and Museum**  
*The Boston Tea Party Ships and Museum bring the brave protest that led to the American Revolution to life through engaging reenactments on your tour. You will be immersed in the issues of the day as you join Samuel Adams and the Sons of Liberty in their protest against the Crown's unjust taxes. HUZDAH!*
- 11:00 AM Arrive at **Faneuil Hall** and **Quincy Market** for lunch (**\$20 on a Jassby card included**).

- 12:30 PM Enjoy a **Guided Walking Tour of Boston's Historic Freedom Trail**  
*Start at the golden dome of the State House atop Beacon Hill, and walk through the Boston Common, America's oldest park. Continue past Park Street Church where William Lloyd Garrison gave the first anti-slavery speech in 1829. Visit the Old Granary Burial Ground, resting place of Paul Revere, John Hancock, Sam Adams and Mother Goose. Walk through the Colonial Section of Old Boston. Visit the site of the Boston Massacre. View Faneuil Hall, the **Paul Revere House, Old North Church**, and many more sights.*

- 3:00 PM Arrive for admission to the **USS Constitution and Constitution Museum**.

*Visiting the USS Constitution Museum offers a captivating journey into American maritime history. Located in the historic Charlestown Navy Yard in Boston, the Museum provides an immersive experience that highlights the legacy of "Old Ironsides," the world's oldest commissioned naval vessel still afloat. Through engaging exhibits, interactive displays, and a wealth of artifacts, visitors can explore the ship's storied past, its pivotal role in the War of 1812, and the lives of the sailors who served on USS Constitution.*

- 4:00 PM Transfer to the **Bunker Hill Monument**.  
*On June 17, 1775, New England soldiers faced the British army for the first time in a pitched battle. Popularly known as "The Battle of Bunker Hill," bloody fighting took place throughout a hilly landscape of fenced pastures that were situated across the Charles River from Boston. Though the British forces claimed the field, the casualties inflicted by the Provincial soldiers from Massachusetts, Connecticut, and New Hampshire were staggering. Of the some 2,400 British soldiers and Marines engaged, some 1,000 were wounded or killed.*

9:45 AM Arrive in Lexington for your **guided tour of the Lexington Battle Green.**  
1875 Massachusetts Avenue, Lexington, MA 02420

*On this one-hour tour, your expert guide in colonial dress will take you across this National Historic Landmark where "the first blood was spilt in the dispute with Great Britain," as George Washington wrote in his diary. It is considered consecrated ground, both for the blood that was shed on it and for the militiamen who are interred here.*

11:15 AM Depart for Concord.

11:30 AM Arrive at **Minute Man National Historical Park.**  
174 Liberty Street, Concord, MA 01742

*The North Bridge in Concord, Massachusetts is often referred to as the location of the "shot heard round the world," and the beginning of the American War for Independence. On the morning of April 19, 1775, Colonial Militia from Concord and surrounding towns exchanged gunfire with British regulars guarding the critical river crossing. Although the fighting at the North Bridge lasted only a few seconds, it marked the beginning of a massive battle that raged over 16 miles along the Bay Road from Boston to Concord, and included some 1,700 British regulars and over 4,000 Colonial militia. (NOTE: the visitors center will not be open)*

12:30 PM **A box lunch is included today.**

1:15 PM For the afternoon activities you will be split into two groups on separate coaches:  
Group 1: Arrive in Concord at the **Louisa May Alcott Orchard House.**  
399 Lexington Road, Concord, MA 01742

*The house is most noted for being where Louisa May Alcott wrote and set her beloved classic, Little Women, in 1868 at a "shelf desk" her father built especially for her. Fortunately, there have been no major structural changes to the house since the Alcotts' time, with ongoing preservation efforts adhering to the highest standards of authenticity. Since approximately 80% of the furnishings on display were owned by the Alcotts, the rooms look very much as they did when the family lived here, causing many modern-day visitors to comment that, "A visit to Orchard House is like a walk through Little Women!"*



**(SUNDAY, MARCH 21, 2027 – continued)**

- 1:15 PM **Group 2: Arrive at Walden Pond State Reservation.**  
*Massachusetts Route 126 (Walden St. and Concord Rd.), Concord, MA 01742*  
*Best known through Henry David Thoreau's Walden, Walden Pond and the surrounding Walden Woods was a favorite destination for walks by local Concord Transcendentalists Thoreau and Ralph Waldo Emerson. Thoreau's writings inspired respect for nature and even, some consider, the birth of the conservation movement. Today, Walden Pond comprises the heart of the Walden Pond State Reservation and is designated a National Historic Landmark, ensuring that visitors can enjoy the area as Thoreau once did.*
- 3:00 PM Groups swap locations to visit the opposite attraction.
- 4:30 PM Board your coaches and depart.
- 5:00 PM **Dinner and gameplay at Dave and Buster's**  
*271 Mishawum Road, Woburn, MA*
- Dinner includes flatbread pizza, mini pretzel dogs w/ ketchup, boneless wings w/ranch, garlic butter pretzel sticks w/ marinara, French fries, and unlimited soft drinks. A \$20 power card for game play is included.

*Columbia Point, Boston, MA 02125*  
*The John F. Kennedy Presidential Library and Museum is the national memorial to 35th President of the United States, John F. Kennedy, and the only Presidential Library in New England. The Museum utilizes original artifacts alongside remastered audio and visual recordings to bring to life the iconic speeches of President Kennedy.*

- 1:00 PM Arrive at the airport.
