

## **News Release/Notification to the Community Open Sites and Closed Enrolled (Needy area)**

*Clarinda Community Schools* is participating in the Summer Food Service Program. Meals will be provided to all children without charge and are the same for all children regardless of race, color, national origin, sex (including gender identity and sexual orientation), age or disability, and there will be no discrimination during the course of the meal service. Meals will be provided, at a first come, first serve basis, at the sites and times listed below:

Starting June 1st and running through July 31st, breakfast and lunch will be served on site at the Garfield Elementary Commons and Clarinda High School Commons. Breakfast will be served from 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and lunch will be served from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at both sites. All meals must be consumed on sites during this time. Entrance for the elementary lunch program will be the South Entrance, and the entrance to the High School will be the Main Entrance. Meals served to 0-18. Weekender To-Go bags will be available at both buildings on Fridays. Bags will provide 2 breakfast meals and 2 Lunch Meals. Pick up for the elementary will be at the South Entrance and the High School will be at the Main Entrance.
